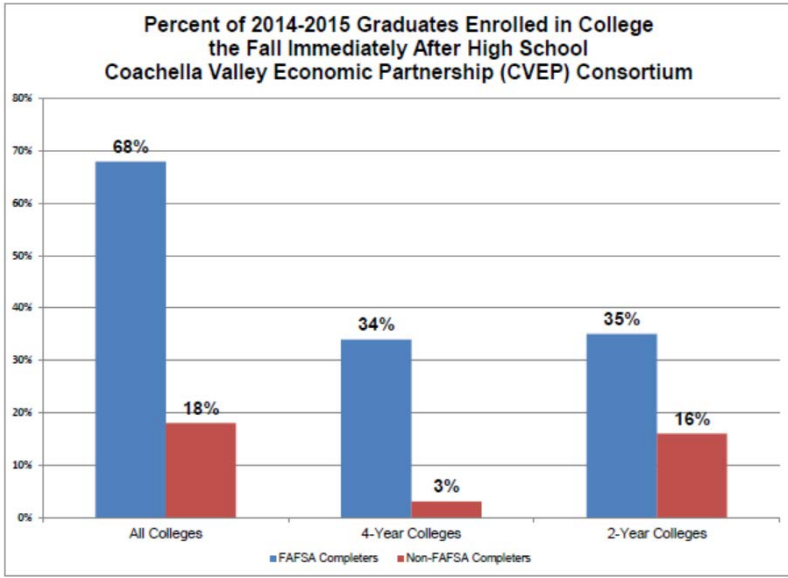


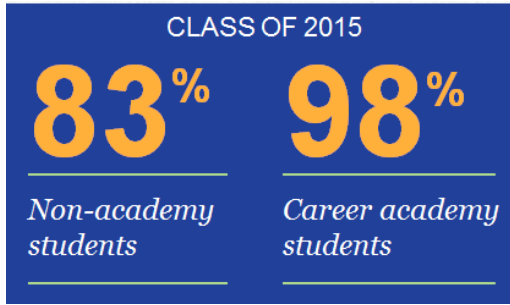
Coachella Valley Regional Plan for College and Career Success 2016 Convening Data Metrics

Students in a pathway program have a higher GPA, especially those in Engineering, AVID and Health Science and Medical Technology

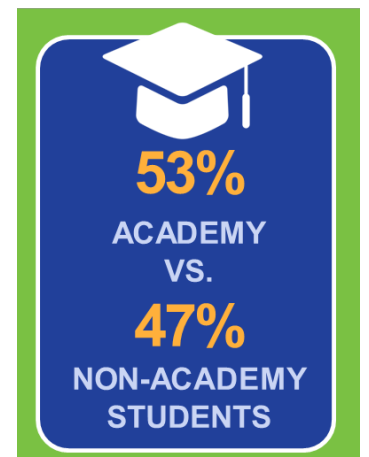

Enrollment in College Fall Immediately (Among Graduates)



Two in five students in a pathway program graduate A-G ready, this drops to 30% for non-pathways students.

Pathway students are more likely to enroll in college immediately following high school. Of the 53%, slightly more than half (51%) enroll in a 4-year. Of non-pathways students, the majority (57%) enter a two-year school. Health academy has the highest enrollment rate (69%), following by AVID (66%)
